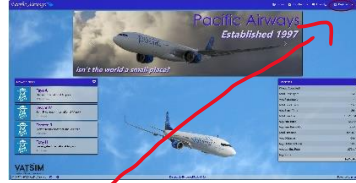




# PHPvms Tutorial



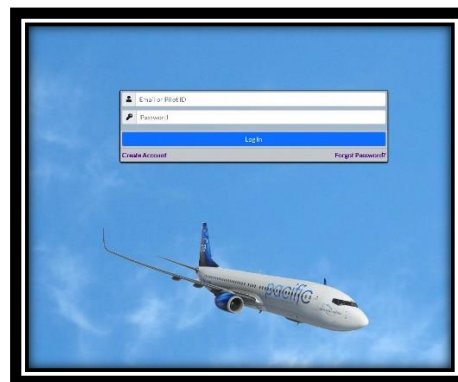
Go to <https://pacificairways.net> and click on registration.

This is your Dashboard. All areas of the website are reached from the Dashboard. On the top is the blue navigation bar. Clicking on items on the navigation bar, will show drop down subcategories you can go to. The Navigation bar stays on top no matter what page you are viewing. Click "Dashboard" on the navigation bar to go back to the dashboard any time. Here on the dashboard, you can see the flights that are in progress from all Pacific Airways pilots, both on and offline. You can view your last pirep details (your last flight), Your present position, News and information, weather for the last airport you landed at. There are monthly and personal statistics on best landings, most and longest flights. If you just registered, you would always start from the hub you designated on your application. There are so many things the site does, too many to list here. Try going from page to page to learn it all. Go back to your Dashboard at any time.

**Finding flights** – On the top navigation bar, click on "Flight Operations" then "Flights" This shows all our regular flightlines, there are approx. 3500 of them. In the search box, enter your search parameters like time, distance, departure or arrival airport, subfleet and click find. All the flights that match your search will appear. Find the flight you want and click on the flight number. This will show details on the flight. You can file a manual pirep or import into ACARS from this page.

**Logbook and profile** – From your dashboard, click on your name. On the dropdown menu, if you click “Reports” it shows you all of your pireps. This is the equivalent of the old logbook, you can also file a manual pirep from this page.

From the same dropdown menu, click on “Profile”. This shows all your personal statistics. On the box (Top Left), you can change your email, password or upload a personal profile photo.

**API Key** – In the profile, you have an API key. This is like a social security number that identifies you from all other pilots. To view your API, you will need to click on the icon next to API key to expose the number. You will need this number to set up your ACARS. You can change your API key anytime you want from this page.



**Jumpseat Travel** – On your dashboard, There is a box for Jumpseat Travel. This is how you can move yourself from one airport to another without having to make a flight. Type in the location you wish to move to, select it, then click “Travel” Jump seating will cost you money from your bank
